E277 Executive Committee report

The Executive Officer summarised the report that had been circulated with the agenda. Those present were pleased to note the healthy set of accounts for 2016/2017 although attention was drawn to the fact that membership fees alone do not fund the costs of running the ERNLLCA office.

The question of the high turnover of Clerks was discussed which, all agreed, was a worrying trend.

E278 Matter referred from the previous meeting – ERNLLCA website

The Executive Officer sought clarification of what was being asked for. Unfortunately the attendees who had raised this at the April meeting could not be present and the members of the committee explained that some form of index for the website would be of use.

RESOLVED: That Officers will explore this as part of a wider review of the website facility.

E279 ERNLLCA Annual Conference

The Chairman drew everyone's attention to the date and venue for the 2017 annual conference which will be held at the Village Hotel in Hull 17 November. The ERNLLCA office will issue further details in due course.

E280 Quick Brief – Complaints

The Executive Officer explained the rationale behind including this topic as a Quick Brief. There were rising concerns about the amount of time being consumed by councils and by ERNLLCA in trying to resolve disputes between councillors and officers, and vice versa.

Those present were reminded that all have the right to complain and that there are formal processes in place within all councils to resolve such complaints. None of the foregoing is perfect and every mechanism is time consuming, using up scarce and valuable council resources and inevitably the experience will leave a scar.

History is littered with examples of conflict leading to discussion which leads to resolution. So the point of this brief is to promote alternative strategies to making a formal complaint. Dispute within a council hurts everyone including the tax-payer.

Alternatives to formal processes were discussed including the use of a third party. The committee agreed everyone should have a right to be heard but that does not mean everyone is always right.

The committee agreed that councils should consider other forms of resolving disputes.

E281 Open Forum

A: Garton on the Wolds

Councillor Poessl reported on a speight of vehicular burglaries; on-going speeding problems and 4X4 vehicles ploughing up local lanes. An upcoming planning application should bring jobs to the community. Councillors have been busy painting the bus shelter and spraying dog droppings pink in the hope that this will highlight the problem to irresponsible dog owners. There had been progress on work with the village pond and there had been success in obtaining funding from Tesco.

B: Bridlington Town Council

The Town Council had been busy with planning applications including objecting to the proposal to move the coach park to the cliff tops.

The Staff team is co-coordinating a list of defibrillators throughout the town and this information will be published.

The Town Clerk also referred to the in-house training events delivered by ERNLLCA.

C: Langtoft Parish Council

Councillor Noble reported on work with the new MUGA which was partly funded by Tesco. The spoil from the MUGA installation will be used as a BMX track.

D: Driffield Town Council

Reference was made to a highways consultation and the putting down for yellow lines. The town's CCTV may be in need of upgrade at a potential cost of £10,000.

The Annual Meeting of the Executive Committee was held on Saturday 29 July 2017 and dealt with a number of governance items and constitutional business. The following appointments were made;

- Chairman: Councillor Tony Cooper (Driffield Town Council)
- Vice-Chairman: Councillor David Knowles (Beverley Town Council)
- Resources Sub-Committee: Councillors Martin Archer (Waltham Parish Council); Brian Brooks (Hibaldstow Parish Council); Tony Cooper; Gordon Thurston (Hedon Town Council); and David Wells (Kirmington and Croxton Parish Council)
- Resources Sub-Committee Chair: Councillor David Wells
- Resources Sub-Committee Vice-Chair: Councillor David Knowles
- NALC Council: Councillor Gordon Thurston
- NALC Annual General Meeting: Councillors Tony Cooper; Gordon Thurston and Peter Hemmerman (Market Weighton Town Council). The Executive Officer to attend in a non-voting capacity
- Northern Group of Local Councils Associations: Councillors Peter Hemmerman and Gordon Thurston with Councillors David Whiteley (Bottesford Town Council) and Tony Cooper as deputies
- Yorkshire and Humber Regional Training Partnership: Councillor Tony Cooper and the Executive Officer.

Members concurred that the Member/Officer Protocol could be revised to incorporate a proposal that mediation of some form should be entered into before formal processes are entered into in an attempt to address a grievance or allegation. It was further suggested that this could be viewed as a prequel to ERNLLCA becoming involved and that the Executive Officer could levy a charge for any intervention work undertaken to assist a council resolve a problem where mediation had not been explored.

Members considered the suggestion from a district committee that the Executive Committee is asked to explore the creation of a pool of trained people who could act as a first point of intervention to help councils overcome internal problems. Discussion centred on the cost of training such individuals, their independence, how their performance could be monitored, the creation of an “ERNLLCA culture” in terms of how all such individuals would operate and what liability might accrue to ERNLLCA. The matter will be re-considered following the preparation of the Member/Officer Protocol.

Councillor Thurston presented his report which had been circulated with the agenda. Members of the Executive Committee expressed concern over the deficit NALC appeared to be operating. The Executive Officer was asked about the number of legal enquiries he had sent to NALC and about the helpfulness of the replies. Reference was made to the Government advocating a better take-up of Neighbourhood Plans but members of the Committee expressed some alarm at the cost of undertaking such a venture and the limited grant funding that is available.

The Executive Officer summarised the Transparency Code update report that had been circulated with the agenda and drew attention to ERNLLCA’s on-going success rate in helping councils access funding. ERNLLCA, in terms of funding allocated to councils, was noted as being the second-best performance county association in the country.

The Executive Officer summarised the report that had been circulated with the agenda. He explained that two councils had not renewed their membership and that, in addition to the three councils reported on at the last meeting, another parish council has asked to join the Association. Since the Executive Committee meeting, the two non-renewing councils have rejoined.

The Executive Officer reported on the work being undertaken through the Desktop Advisory Service and in delivering training. He expressed grave concerns about the functioning of two un-named member councils and the disproportionate amount of time given over to them.

Members discussed the Constitution and whether or not there was a need to bring it into line with other county association constitutions in terms of who qualifies to be elected to the Executive Committee. Discussion also centred on how ERNLLCA should promote training and development of councillors. Two resolutions were agreed for presentation to the Annual General Meeting.

The Executive Officer briefed the Committee on progress with the recruitment of a Local Councils Development Officer.
